REASONS FOR SERVING GOD 2 Corinthians 5:10-20

Introduction:

Why do we serve God? Some do because they want to; others because they feel they have to; some because they love to; others because of wrong motives (money, fame, recognition, praise). Based on our text, we will examine five reasons for serving God.

I. We Are Ambassadors for Christ (v. 20)

- **A.** The Ambassador is an official representative of one's country who resides in the court or Capital of another country.
- B. Our citizenship is in Heaven, but we represent God's interest on earth.
- C. Our duty is to reconcile men with God (vv. 18-19)

II. We Have Our New Life (v. 17)

- A. "A New Creature" is a born-again Christian Believer.
- **B.** "A New Creature" can rest assured that his old self and old ways will never be counted against him again (Rom 8:1).
- C. "A New Creature" delights in pleasing God.
- **D.** Christians should have a testimony about Jesus (Mark 5:19).

III. We Receive the Love of Christ (v. 14)

- A. The love of Christ for us caused Him to die for us (v. 15)
- B. Christ died to create a new man

IV. The Terror of the Lord (v. 11)

- A. The terror of the Lord is God's terrible judgment on sin and the horrors of Hell.
- B. We should persuade others about the terror of the Lord
- C. Plead with them earnestly with a sense of urgency

V. We will be Rewarded at the Judgment Seat of Christ (v. 10)

- A. The judgment of Believers will determine his reward and the degree of reward, whether good (gain) or bad (loss).
- B. Has your service for God been wholehearted? Constant? Voluntary?
- C. The Judgment Seat of Christ is a great reason for Believers to serve God in a great way.

 - 1. I am a Good Person (Rom 3:10; 23)
 - 2. Is sin a big deal? (Rom 6:23)
