LUKE 22:7-23
(Parallel Passages: Matt 26:17-29; Mark 14:12-25; 1 Cor 11:23-24)

Introduction:

Timeless Truths at the Lord's Table

The Lord's Supper is a reminder of the death of Christ and of its sacrificial character on our behalf, a symbol of our vital connection with the Lord and a testimony of His second coming. The Lord's Supper sets forth the message that salvation is by grace alone, on the merits of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, and not by anything that we can do.

 - (Luke 22:8, 13; Exod 6:6-8; Luke 22:8-13; 1 Cor 11:27-29)
