Thomas, also called Didymus which means twin, was one of the twelve Apostles of Jesus. He is known as "Doubting Thomas" because he doubted Jesus' Resurrection when first told of it by the other ten Apostles (Judas died before Christ's Resurrection). Later, Thomas confessed his faith upon seeing Jesus' crucifixion wounds.
