Philippians 1:19-26

INTRODUCTION:

- <u>Focus on the Future</u> Our past has been changed, because in God's eyes, we do not have a past, only a future.
- In the midst of troubles, stay Focused on the Future maintain the attitude of Paul Have a genuine desire to meet the Lord and yet remain committed to the work He has given you until He calls you home.
- I. The Believer's Expectation and Hope: Magnify the Lord (v. 20)
 - A. Our Earnest Expectation
 - **B.** Our Christian Hope
 - C. As Paul Focused on the Future, he wanted Jesus to be magnified in his body: that he might not be ashamed fulfil the Great Commission (Matt 28:16-20).
- **II.** The Believer's Commitment in Life or Death (v. 21)
 - A. "For me to live is Christ" (v. 21a)
 - **B. "To Die is Gain"** (v. 21b)
- III. The Believer's Dilemma To Live or Die (Depart) to be with Christ (vv. 22-23)
 - A. Fruitful Service.
 - B. Depart to be with Christ.
- IV. The Believer's Willingness to Serve Sacrificially (vv. 24-26)
 - A. Paul assured the Philippian Believers that he would abide faithfully unto the church as long as he was alive, for advancement of their joy and faith (v. 25).
 - **B.** Paul desired to see the Philippian Believers again (v. 26)
 - C. Serving sacrificially comes with a price.
