INTRODUCTION:

Today, we will study the final Three Descriptions and Effects of the Word of God (vv. 8b-9).

- 1. The Commandment of the Lord is Pure It Enlightens our Eyes,
- 2. The Fear of the Lord is Clean It Endures Forever
- 3. The Judgments of the Lord are True They are Righteous Altogether (Entirely).
- I. The Commandment of the Lord is Pure It Enlightens Our Eyes (v. 8b)
 - A. The Commandment (Word of God) is Pure (2 Pet 1:20-21; 2 Tim 3:16).
 - **B.** It Enlightens Our Eyes (2 Pet 1:9; Acts 26:18; Ps 119:105, Ps 119:30).
 - C. The Commandment of the Lord Enlightens our Eyes by Pointing Us to Christ Who is the "End of the Law." (Rom 10:4; Matt 5:17).
 - **D.** The Commandment of the Lord Enlightens our Eyes by Leading us to the Incarnate Word (John 1:4-5).
- II. The Fear of the Lord is Clean It Endures Forever (v. 9a)
 - A. The Word of God (Fear) is Worthy of our Greatest Respect (Prov 9:10)
 - **B.** The Word of God is Clean (Pure) (Ps 12:6; Ps 119:140).
 - C. The Word of God Endures Forever (Isa 40:8; Ps 119:89).
- III. The Judgments of the Lord are True They are Righteous Altogether (v. 9b)
 - A. What is True in One Verse of the Bible is True in all of God's Word Altogether
 - B. We Should Not Pick and Choose Which Verses or Commands We are to Obey the Bible for it is Righteous (Ps 119:142, 160)
 - C. God is Fair and Just Everyone can be Saved Salvation is available to all.

 - The Commandment of the Lord is Pure It Enlightens our Eyes,
 The Fear of the Lord is Clean It Endures Forever
