GOD'S AMAZING GRACE Ephesians 2:8-10

INTRODUCTION:

Grace is the undeserved, unmerited, and unearned favor and blessings of God. Grace is God's mercy, kindness, and goodness toward us, even though we do not deserve it.

• Herbert Lockyer summarized Grace by the acoustic – <u>God's Riches At Christ's Expense</u>.

In this evangelistic message, we will examine two facts related to God's Amazing Grace: I. We are Saved by God's Grace (vv. 8-9; Rom 11:6)

- A. God's Grace is Unique
 - **B.** For whom did Christ die for: (Rom 5:6, 8, 10)
 - C. We are Saved through Faith (John 3:16; 5:24)
 - **D.** God's Grace is Free Grace came by Christ Jesus (Rom 3:24; Titus 3:5; Prov 30:12)
- II. We are God's Workmanship (v. 10; Eph 2:5; John 3:3, 5-6; 2 Pet 1:4; 2 Cor 5:17)
 - A. We are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus.
 - **B.** Believers are created to do good works. God saves us for good works and by good works (1 Cor 10:31; Matt 5:16; Col 1:10; Titus 2:7).

CONCLUSION:

- A. Grace is getting what we do not deserve and not getting what we do deserve.
- **B.** "The <u>motive</u> of Grace is the infinite, compassionate love of a merciful God, but the <u>work</u> of Grace was the death of Christ on the Cross (Billy Graham).
- **C.** Amazing Grace, How Sweet the Sound, That saved a wretch like me. I once was lost, but now I am found, Was blind but now I see.
- **D.** God's Grace is available to all Accept Jesus as Savior **Today**!
