INTRODUCTION:

Grace is God choosing to bless us rather than curse us as our sin deserves. It is God’s kindness to the undeserving. The Grace of God is His undeserved favor to mankind.

- “It is “by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God” (Ephesians 2:8).

- C. The Grace of God Teaches us Where to Look – A Life of Expectation** (v. 13; John 14:3; Acts 1:10-11; Heb 9:28)

III. THE PURPOSE OF GRACE (vv. 13c – 14; Rom 12:1)

- A. Christians are Consecrated by God Himself**
- B. Christians are Consecrated at a Great Cost** (v. 14)

CONCLUSION:

A. The Grace of God is a Doctrinal Message to be Proclaimed (v. 15; John 3:16; 1 Tim 1:15; John 4:10, 14)

B. God’s Grace is Free and Available to All.

C. ABC’s of Salvation

- **A – Admit** that you’re a sinner and that you cannot save yourself (Rom 3:23, Eph 2:8-9).
- **B – Believe** that Jesus died on the Cross and rose again for your sins (Rom 5:8, 1 Cor. 15:3-4).
- **C – Confess**/Call on Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior (Rom 10:9-13)
