## **INTRODUCTION:**

# Denial is to refuse to admit the truth or reality of something that is unpleasant, to know what is true, yet confess a falsehood.

• "If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9).

- **B.** Peter had previously confessed Jesus (Matt 16:13-16; 26:33-35; Luke 22:31-33)
- IV. <u>THE DENIAL OF IGNORANCE</u> (vv. 59-60)
  - A. Peter's speech of dialect was of a Galilean (v. 59; Mark 14:70)
  - **B.** Peter Claimed Ignorance (v. 60)

# V. THE ANSWER OF DENIAL (vv. 61-62)

- A. Peter remembered the Lord's Words (v. 61)
- **B.** Peter left the crowd to be alone with God (v. 62)
- C. Peter expressed Godly sorrow (2 Cor 7:10)
