PRAYER: THE FIRM FOUNDATION Philippians 1:1-11

INTRODUCTION:

Prayer is defined as communication with God. Christians do this by praising God and confessing our sins before Him, thanking Him and asking Him for our needs and desires.

o "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by **prayer and** supplication with **thanksgiving** let your requests be made known unto God" (Philippians 4:6).

Paul began this letter to the Philippian Believers with the firm foundation of Prayer -A Model for us to follow. How Should We Pray? Pray with Thanksgiving and Petition.

- I. PRAY WITH THANKSGIVING (vv. 3-8)
 - **A.** <u>Thanksgiving</u> expressing gratitude for having food, clothing, shelter, health, family, church family, friends, journey mercies (Ps 100:4-5; 118:1).
 - **B.** Paul used the Phrase "You All" four times in verses 1-11 (vv. 4, 7, 8)
 - C. The Three Way Fellowship (Partnership)
 - **D.** The Three-Dimensioned in Time (vv. 5-6)
- **II. PRAY WITH PETITION** (vv. 9-11)
 - A. Petition is making a request known unto God for ourselves as well as for others.
 - B. Paul was thankful for partnership in Gospel Grace, now his prayer is focus on progress in Gospel growth (v. 9; Matt 22:36-39)
 - **C.** Why Paul is Praying (vv. 10-11; 1 Thess 4:12)

- A. "Prayer delights God's ear; it melts His heart; and opens His hand. God cannot deny a praying soul." Thomas Watson
- **B.** "Prayer is the link that connects us to God." A.B. Simpson
- C. According to John 15:5 Christ's teaching on the Vine and the Branches Christ said, ... without me ye can do nothing."

- o **A Admit** that you're a sinner and that you cannot save yourself (Rom 3:23, Eph 2:8-9).
- o $\mathbf{B} \underline{\mathbf{Believe}}$ that Jesus died on the Cross and rose again for your sins (Rom 5:8, 1 Cor. 15:3-4).
- o C Confess/Call on Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior (Rom 10:9-13)
