THE TWENTY-THIRD PSALM

(Psalm 23:1-6)

INTRODUCTION:

- A. The 23rd Psalm is the most well-known chapter of the Bible. It is a powerful reminder of God's Grace and Guidance.
 - o "The Lord is my shepherd; I shall not want" (Psalm 23:1).

Based on our text, we sill study six elements of Christ as Our Shepherd.

- I. "THE LORD IS MY SHEPHERD" (v. 1a)
 - A. A Shepherd Cares for his Sheep as they Cannot Take Care of Themselves.
 - B. Christ is the Believer's Shepherd
 - C. Christ is Our Shepherd He purchased us with His own blood. He cares for His sheep (Eph 1:7; 1 John 1:7).
 - D. Christ gave His Life for His Sheep. He Cares for His Sheep (John 10:10)
 - E. "I Shall Not Want" (v. 1b; Mark 10:17-22; Heb 13:5)

II. HE MAKETH ME TO LIE DOWN IN GREEN PASTURES (v. 2)

- A. A Sheep will not lie down from rest unless he is free of fear. Sheep are timid animals.
- B. For Christians Christ the Shepherd being nearby His presence removes all fear in our lives. Allow God to control your life. He knows what he is doing (2 Tim 1:7).

III. <u>"HE RESTORETH MY SOUL"</u> (v. 3)

- A. Cast Sheep are overturned sheep that cannot get up on their own.
- **B.** David knew what it meant to be Cast (Isa 53:6; 1 John 1:7-9)

IV. 'THY ROD AND THY STAFF THEY COMFORT ME" (v. 4)

- A. A Rod was a sapling with an enlarged base and head of hardwood.
- B. The Rod is symbolic of the Word of God -which is an extension of God's mind and will in dealing with mankind (Ps 139:23-24).
- C. A "Staff" was a long slender stick with a hook or crook on the end. It served as a symbol of concern and compassion; symbolic of God's Spirit! (John 16:13)

V. "THOU ANOINTED MY HEAD WITH OIL" (v. 5)

- A. Sheep are troubled by nose flies which cause intense irritation and frustration.
- B. In our Christian walk situations and circumstances when things are not going right we need the anointing of the Holy Spirit to overcome a troubled mind and Spirit.
- C. Just as with sheep needing a continuous application of ointment, Christians should receive a daily anointing of the Holy Spirit.

VI. "I WILL DWELL IN THE HOUSE OF THE LORD EOREVER" (v. 6)

- A. This Psalm opened with "The Lord is My Shepherd." Now it closes with "and I will dwell in the House of the Lord Forever."
- **B.** Sheep are satisfied with the care of the Shepherd and have no desire for change (Rom 8:35-39).

CONCLUSION:

- A. Martin Luther King, Jr. spoke about Psalm 23 in his speech "The Seeking God", saying that God is like a Shepherd who leads people through life, even through the Valley of the Shadow. King said that God seeks people through pain and peril;, and that people can find comfort in the idea that they will not fear evil because "the Lord is my Shepherd."
- B. Christ, the Shepherd will meet you, care for you, and give you Eternal Life.
- C. "And being made perfect, he became the author of eternal salvation unto all them that obey him" (Heb 5:9).

D. ABC's of Salvation

- o A Admit that you're a sinner and that you cannot save yourself (Rom 3:23, Eph 2:8-9).
- B <u>Believe</u> that Jesus died on the Cross and rose again for your sins (Rom 5:8, 1 Cor. 15:3-4).
- o C <u>Confess/Call</u> on Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior (Rom 10:9-13)
