### THE TRUTH ABOUT DIVORCE Matthew 5:31-32

### **INTRODUCTION:**

We are continuing our Sermon Series on The Sermon On The Mount (Matt 5-7). In this message, we will study five points related to The Truth About Divorce.

• "What therefore God hath joined together, let not man put asunder" (Mark 10:9).

#### I. <u>THE VIEW OF THE SCRIBES AND PHARISEES ON DIVORCE</u> (v. 31)

- A. Jesus moves from The Sin of Adultery (Matt 5:27-30) directly to Divorce.
- B. In the days of Jesus, the Scribes and Pharisees used Deut 24:1-4 as the standard for Divorce.
- **C.** This **"writing of divorcement"** (Certificate of Divorce) served three purposes (Deut 24:1-4).

# II. <u>THE VIEW OF JESUS ON DIVORCE</u> (v. 32)

- A. Jesus revealed that the Pharisees were looking at Divorce from the wrong perspective.
- **B.** God's design for marriage (Matt 19:1-12; Gen 2:23-24).
- C. Jesus acknowledges that Moses permitted Divorce, but explains that it was due to the hardness of their heart not God's original plan (vv. 7-8; Mal 2:16).
- **D.** The Sanctity of Marriage (Matt 19:6; Mark 10:9)
- **E.** Working On It (1 John 1:7; Col 3:23)

# III. <u>THE CONSEQUENCES OF DIVORCE</u> (v. 32b)

- A. The husband who divorces his wife on grounds other that adultery, makes the innocent wife commit adultery if she remarries.
- B. Mark 10:11-12; Luke 16:18; 1 Cor 7:10-11, 39; 2 Cor 6:14-15).
- C. Problems of Divorce

# IV. <u>THE EXCEPTION TO DIVORCE</u> (v. 39a)

- A. Adultery breaks the union and attachment oneness between husband and wife.
- **B.** The union and attachment of faith, hope, love, trust, assurance, confidence, and trust are broken.
- C. The Lord allows for Divorce and Remarriage of the innocent spouse when adultery is involved.

# V. THE EXPECTATION REGARDING DIVORCE

- A. Divorce in the case of adultery is permitted, but it is not commanded, encouraged or demanded "God hates Divorce" (Mal 2:16).
- **B.** Divorce is a result of sin. However, Divorce and Remarriage are not the unpardonable sin (1 John 1:9).
- C. We should always work toward reconciliation Saving the marriage (Eph 4:32).

#### **CONCLUSION:**

- A. God's original plan for marriage Marriage is meant to be for a lifetime A lifetime of commitment!
- B. Marriage is the making of One from Two When we are joined in marriage we become one flesh.
- **C.** Marriage takes Three to be complete The husband, wife and God in the Center (Anonymous).
- **D.** The marriage bond that joins two hearts No power on earth can break if they commit their lives to Christ, and of His love partake (D. DeHaan).

#### E. ABC's of Salvation

- A <u>Admit</u> that you're a sinner and that you cannot save yourself (Rom 3:23, Eph 2:8-9).
- **B** <u>Believe</u> that Jesus died on the Cross and rose again for your sins (Rom 5:8, 1 Cor. 15:3-4).
- $\circ$  C <u>Confess</u>/Call on Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior (Rom 10:9-13)
